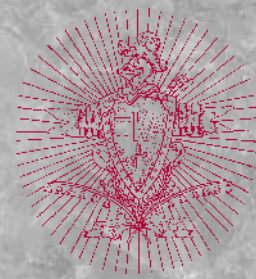

DELTA GAMMA CELEBRATES IMPROVEMENTS AND ACHIEVEMENTS

Chapter Boasts 41-Man Pledge Class



The Delta Gamma Chapter has seen improvements, achievements, and changes since last fall ranging from chapter-wide adjustments to individual accomplishments. Overall, the chapter is on its way to becoming a top chapter on campus and nationally proclaimed by university staff and memorial headquarters staff.

This winter the chapter adopted a change in elections, moving the term served by executive board members and chairmen to the calendar year as opposed to the school year. The change has created fresh feet in many positions, taking care of the typical problem with senior apathy.

RECRUITMENT

This spring we recruited a campus-high 41 men—the biggest pledge class we have had in recent years. Thirty-eight of the new members were initiated, putting our chapter at 107 men and ranking Pike the fourth largest chapter on Miami's campus.

CHAPTER RATING

Shortly after recruitment came to a close, **Tim Smerz, Eta Nu '05**, came to Miami to complete the annual consultant evaluation visit and report. We reported a 2.96 out of 4.0 due to the lack of experience of the chairman reporting. Although the score is not what we would have liked to obtain, Tim gave us great recommendations and many ideas on how to improve as a chapter.



Delta Gamma traveled to Snowshoe Mountain in West Virginia for our annual ski trip. A good time was had by all.

CHAPTER ACTIVITIES AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Last year the Delta Gamma Chapter represented itself well at the International Fraternity level. We sent five members to the International Convention in Memphis in August, four members to the Chapter Executives Conference in Memphis in January, and nine members to the Regional Conference held in Chicago in February. The events put on by the Memorial Headquarters staff have proved to be pivotal to the improvement in our chapter. This February, **Ethan Basch '06** and I were awarded gold membership for attending five Pike University events. We received five letters of recommendation from International President **Pat Talley, Eta Mu '74**, a golden Pi Kappa Alpha graduation scroll, and were mentioned in a press release to the Forbes Fortune 100 companies.

In March Ethan was hired as a consultant for the 2009-10 school year at the Memorial Headquarters. Ethan is the first Delta Gamma graduate to be hired in recent decades. This supports the fact that the Delta Gamma Chapter is on the rise, locally and nationally.

Since then, several Pikes have helped with other CancerFree Kids fundraisers. For example, the Miami hockey team has adopted CancerFree Kids as their charity for this season. The Pikes have been great about providing volunteers to work several hockey games. To me, that is very impressive and a sign that the Delta Gamma Chapter is doing very well and has successfully recruited some very fine gentlemen. I am once again proud to say I am a Pike from Miami University.

There are often times, while visiting with fellow alumni, where the conversation turns to how the Miami Pikes are doing these days. I am here to report that, in my humble opinion, they are doing quite well! To my fellow alumni, I hope you have the opportunity to visit these men and have a similar experience to mine. I also hope you will support these fine gentlemen any way you can.

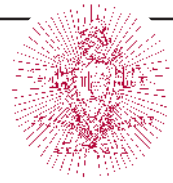
